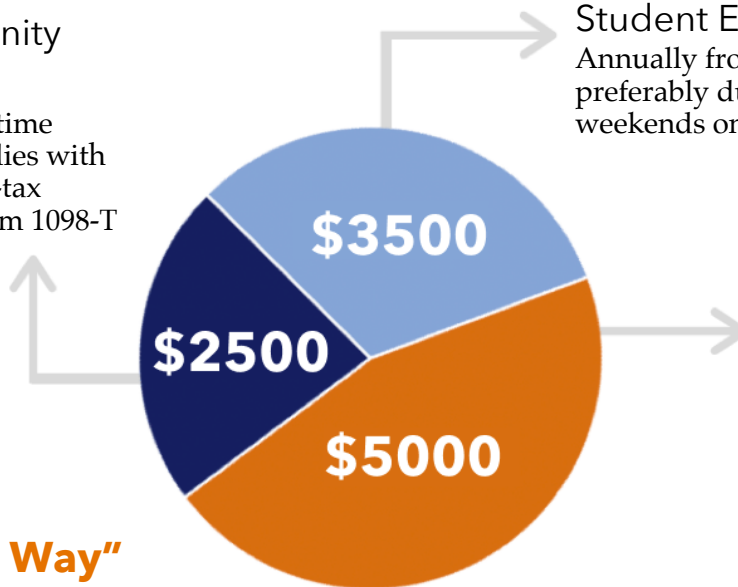
College is more affordable than most families believe.

American Opportunity Tax Credit

Annual benefit (per full-time college student) for families with less than \$160,000 in pre-tax income; qualify with Form 1098-T (free money)

Student Earnings

Annually from a part-time job, preferably during breaks and weekends only



Student Loans

Maximum amount to borrow per year, so student has a modest monthly payment and can be debt-free within 10 years

The Power of the ACT & SAT in New Mexico

Scholarships are listed by the ACT score required on the college website with the comparable SAT score included. Check the individual school's website to verify that your SAT score will qualify for any specific award as some requirements may vary slightly.

The dollar amount in each box in the chart represents the tuition cost after merit-based scholarships that a student with the given test score (listed across the top of each table) would pay for one year of tuition (15 credits per semester) at that college. (Reminder: non-tuition costs, including fees, housing, meals, and books, often add up to an additional ~\$12,000 per year.)

- 1000 Blue boxes signify automatic scholarships (as listed on the college's website). Automatic awards often also require a minimum GPA or class rank.
- 1000 Light gray boxes signify awards require a separate application or special consideration of some kind. (This is only shown if no automatic award exists.)
- Blank boxes signify there is no merit-based scholarship based primarily on that SAT/ACT score at this college; therefore, the student might expect to pay full tuition. The student should still apply for other merit-based and need-based scholarships.

If an entire row is blank, the school does not organize its scholarships by test score or does not provide this specific type of information on its website. An asterisk * indicates fees are included in the school's base tuition price. Textbooks, housing, and meals are generally not included. If a school offers a non-renewable award, the total award amount is averaged throughout the years of attendance. (For example, if a four-year school offers a one-year award of \$500, the number shown is \$125 less than total tuition, as the scholarship is divided by 4.)

Figures are current as of May 2020.

New Mexico Legislative Lottery Scholarship:

- NM residents who graduated from a NM high school or completed a GED while maintaining residency in NM are eligible.
- Students must enroll at a public post-secondary institution within 16 months of graduation and maintain continuous full-time enrollment.
- Qualification is based on the student's **first semester of college**:
 - 15+ credit hours at a 4-year public university or 12+ credit hours at a 2-year public community college
 - 2.5 GPA or higher
- Students must maintain this credit hour enrollment and cumulative GPA each semester to continue renewing the award up to 7 semesters or completion of a bachelor's degree.
- Amount is set by the state each year and is based on the type of institution (research, comprehensive, or community college).
- No application is required, but students should contact their postsecondary institution's financial aid advisor for eligibility verification.
- Participating institutions are denoted with *italics*.
- Some tuition amounts below reflect NM Lottery Scholarship amounts listed on college financial aid websites if they require a specific ACT score to qualify for initial award.

New Mexico Scholarships by School

- Merit-based (academic) institutional scholarships for in-state students are listed. They are automatically awarded and renewable unless otherwise noted.
- Estimated annual tuition is based on 30 total credit hours – one year of classes at 15 credits per semester.
- Non-tuition costs – fees, housing, meals, and books – typically amount to about \$12,000 per year. Some schools have higher costs for housing and meal plans; however, budget-conscious students typically have multiple options in these categories. Some schools also have much higher fees than other colleges; fees are unavoidable.
- All criteria listed are required for consideration for a scholarship unless the word “or” is specifically noted.

New Mexico Legislative Lottery Scholarship: NM residents who graduated from a NM high school are eligible. The scholarship begins the second semester of college, and eligibility is based on a 2.5 college (not high school) GPA for at least 15 credit hours at a four-year NM public university of at least 12 credits at a two-year NM public community college. Award amount varies, and it is not disclosed on all college websites since it changes yearly and is set by the state. (The amount listed may not be the amount a student is awarded next year.) Scholarship is renewable for 7 semesters total. Participating institutions are marked with an asterisk. * More information is available at <https://hed.state.nm.us/financial-aid/scholarships/legislative-lottery>.

New Mexico Bridge to Success Scholarship: This scholarship helps qualifying high school students “bridge” the funding gap during their first semester of college while they work to qualify for the above lottery scholarship. Qualifications and award amounts are listed in each school’s information.
